Friends of the San Pedro River

River Walks

The San Pedro River features some of the richest wildlife habitat in the Southwest. Here you'll find 82 species of mammals, dozens of different reptiles and amphibians and nearly 350 species of birds. In addition, the river supports one of the largest cotton-wood-willow forest canopies remaining in Arizona and is one of the last free-flowing rivers in the Southwest.

The interpretive river walks are usually $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 miles long over easy terrain. They are slower-paced than a hike and suitable for most adults and children.

Every Saturday Morning April 5, 12, 19, 26 River walks depart from the San Pedro House at 8:00am

Bird Walks

The San Pedro River is considered one of the largest and most critical avian migratory corridors remaining in the western US, providing habitat for over 100 species of breeding birds, and provides water, food and shelter for another 250 species of migratory and wintering birds.

Birders, novice or experienced, are invited to attend any of the listed bird walks to introduce them to the diverse avian community found in the SPRNCA. Observe 25 - 50 species on these popular two to three hour bird walks.

History Walk

MILLVILLE RUINS & PETROGLYPHS

The Corbin and Gird stamp mills processed silver ore mined in Tombstone and roared day and night for the "boom" years between 1878 and 1889. It was a "boomtown" in every sense of the word – a quick rise and a rapid decline. This site is also well known for its many petroglyphs etched into the rocky hillsides.

The walk is about one and a half miles and will take about two hours. Be prepared for the weather with good shoes, water, and a hat.

Saturday, April 19, 8:00am Meet at the Millville Parking Area (about one quarter mile east of the San Pedro River, north side of Charleston Road)


Wear appropriate attire for hiking and walking and current weather conditions. Bring at least one quart of water per person. There is **no charge** for the walks; however, donations are accepted to support the docent programs.

HUMMINGBIRD BANDING

Up to 10 species of hummingbirds use the green corridor of the San Pedro River as a freeway between their tropical winter re-treats and their northern nesting grounds.

The public is invited to get a close-up look at these tiny travelers, as staff and volunteers from the **Southeastern Arizona Bird Observatory** capture, band, weigh, measure, and release them as part of long-term studies of the bird life of this vital migration route.


